Content clearly connects to Social Justice, Ethical Principles, and Third Sector.

**Good is defined as:**

Shares most of the "excellent" characteristics.

Work is not as carefully presented, supported and/or reasoned as in "excellent" criteria.

There are no errors with respect to intent of assignment.

Relevance to Third Sector is minimal.

Fair-2

**Fair is defined as:**

Generally competent work.

Some aspects of work are not presented clearly or reasoned adequately.

Comes to terms with assignment but not thoroughly or with rigor.

Relevance to Third Sector is very weak.

Poor-1

**Poor is defined as:**

Assignment is poorly handled.

There are numerous defects in reasoning and the development of ideas.

Materials used are irrelevant or not accurate.

There is no relevance to the Third Sector.
